Butterfly Goodbye
at the
Danville Science Center

DANVILLE — Visit with butterflies for the last time this year in a garden filled with their favorite plants. Collect seeds to plant in spring. Learn how to prepare your garden for winter. **Butterfly Goodbye** is at Danville Science Center's **Butterfly Station and Garden, Sunday, October 18, 1-4 p.m.**

Join master gardener Allison Bellamy as she shares tips on how to winterize your garden. Collect seeds to start your own backyard butterfly habitat in the spring. Get advice on how to trim and mulch plants. Kids can use garden plants to make a colorful wreath as they learn about the parts of a plant.

While you are at the Science Center, visit the newly opened exhibit **Engineer It**. Team up with friends to build a seven-foot arch. Plan a bridge on a computer and test it to see if it can support a bus, truck or train. Design boats to sail in a water tank. Test windmills and airplanes in a wind tunnel. Experiment with gears and pulleys. Discover what work engineers do.

Engineer It is a creation of the Oregon Museum of Science and Industry in Portland. The exhibit is made possible by a grant from the National Science Foundation. Local support provided by the Kiwanis Club of Danville Foundation.

Butterfly Goodbye in the **Butterfly Station and Garden** is free. Donations are appreciated. **Engineer It** is included with Science Center admission. Tickets are \$5 for ages 4-12 and 60+, and \$6 for ages 13-59.
